Overcoming Challenges, Together

It is impossible to turn on the news or open a newspaper these days and not see some-

thing about the influx of immigrants to our country, many of them coming across the Texas border.

As many of you know, Loaves and Fishes played an integral part in the care and resettlement of 726 asylum seekers from Central America in 2019. Now, after a year's reprieve due to Covid-19 and the restrictive immigration policies instituted under the Trump administration, we are once again seeing a steady flow of refugees released



into the Harlingen area. To date, we have assisted over 735 immigrants (418 adults and 308 children) in 2021.

Typically, the refugees are dropped off at

are dropped off at Loaves and Fishes or at the Harlingen bus station. The Loaves and Fishes staff provide



them with food, clothing, hot showers, and basic hygiene and healthcare, to include a rapid COVID test. In addition to addressing their immediate needs, our staff assist

them with arranging travel to their ultimate destination in the Unit-



ed States.

We wish to express our deep appreciation for the invaluable assistance extended by Fr. Robert (Bob) Charlton, SS.CC, and the Queen of Peace Catholic Church, which has played a vital role in this effort ever since we first began in 2019.

HOMELESS PREVENTION

Low to moderate income renters in Upper Cameron or Willacy County may be eligible for rental or utility assistance through Loaves & Fishes' Homeless Prevention Program. Assistance



may last for three months for eligible applicants facing eviction and utility cut off. COVID-19 Rental Assistance available. Call (956) 423-1014 for more information.
